

**Butterflies found at Rospanel Farm
Crows-an-Wra
Penzance
Cornwall, TR19 6HS**

Green-veined white	<i>(Pieris napi)</i>	Not that common
Small white	<i>(Pieris rapae)</i>	Still very plentiful
Large white	<i>(Pieris brassicae)</i>	Far fewer than in the past
Orange-tip	<i>(Anthocharis cardamines)</i>	Two small colonies
Clouded yellow	<i>(Colias croceus)</i>	Vagrant, seen most years, sometimes in large numbers
Peacock	<i>(Inachis io)</i>	Can be seen throughout the year on fine days
Painted lady	<i>(Cynthia cardui)</i>	Breeds most years on thistles after coming across channel
Small tortoiseshell	<i>(Aglais urticae)</i>	Seen on knapweed and hibernating in barns
Red admiral	<i>(Vanessa atalanta)</i>	Plentiful in the autumn on ivy flowers
Meadow brown	<i>(Maniola jurtina)</i>	Quite common
Ringlet	<i>(Aphantopus hyperanthus)</i>	Numbers vary from year to year, but always some
Gate-keeper	<i>(Pyronia tithonus)</i>	Plentiful most years
Small heath	<i>(Coenonympha pamphilus)</i>	Fairly common
Wall brown	<i>(Lasiommata mergera)</i>	Very plentiful most years
Small copper	<i>(Lycaena phlaeas)</i>	At least two small colonies
Holly blue	<i>(Celastrina argiolus)</i>	Only present since 1998 (more holly and ivy planted)
Common blue	<i>(Polyommatus icarus)</i>	Becoming very scarce, used to be very prolific
Small skipper	<i>(Thymelicus sylvestris)</i>	Still plentiful
